In the Atmospheric Conference, the pennant chase just got very interesting! Chestertown played .500 ball (21-21) in Period 2 and this allowed Bloomington (28-14) to surge past and take a 1-game lead! North Adams (26-16) pulled to within 2 games of the lead! Sioux Falls (20-22) and Arkansas (22-20) slipped to 4 and 5 games off the pace, respectively! This is the closest pennant race in the TML Retro era! Only Summer and Sonoma are out of the post season battle in Period 3, but could be spoilers!


Over in the Oceanic Conference, the Albany Avalanche posted a Period 2 best 32-10 record and took at 2-game lead over rival Oakdale (30-12 in Period 2). Duluth, in 3rd place, played .500 ball 21-21, but now trail by a nearly unsurmountable 17 games! Period 3 will determine home field advantage for the top two.

The new batting leader is **Duluth's Earl Webb** at .402, followed by **Chestertown's Charlie Grimm** at .392. Eight players are still batting over .350! **Oakdale's** repeat "Player of the Period" Babe Ruth is still the leader in HR (36), SLG (.715), Runs (121) and RC (151), and is the new leader in OBP (.507) and Walks (120)! **Albany's Goose Goslin** is the RBI leader with 120. The SB leader is **Arkansas's Roy Johnson** (28 SB, 10 CS).

The new ERA leader is Oakdale's "Player of the Period" Lefty Grove at 2.34, followed by Beverly's Syl Johnson at 2.56. Grove is 2nd in victories (17-5) and Strikeouts (115). The Strikeout leader is teammate Carl Hubbell (121 K) and the victories leader is Sioux Falls's Wes Ferrell (18-4). The Saves leader is still Bloomington's Carl Fischer (20/23 SVO, 35 GR, 2.57).


