## It's Déjà Vu All Over Again!

The Walla Walla Wombats posted a league best 31-11 Period 3 record, capturing the Oceanic Conference Pennant by 7 games over the Beverly Hillbillies (28-14 in Period 3). Walla Walla's league-leading pitching staff boasts four 20-game winners (see below)! This will be the $5^{\text {th }}$ straight Conference Final between these two teams. Beverly will try to avenge their sweep last season!

Over in the Atmospheric Conference, the defending TML Champs Arkansas Travelers put up another solid 26-16 Period 3 record and captured their $7^{\text {th }}$ consecutive Atmospheric Conference Pennant! Sioux Falls (29-13) closed to within 4 games to take $2^{\text {nd }}$. Sioux Falls will attempt to stop Arkansas from advancing to their $6^{\text {th }}$ straight TML World Series! They nearly did it last season taking the Travs to a $7^{\text {th }}$ game!

The batting champion was Duluth's Johnny Mize who fell one hit short of . 400, finishing at . 399! Bronx's Luke Appling was $2^{\text {nd }}$ at .371 . The $H R$ champ was Arkansas's Jimmie Foxx with 52 HR. Beverly's Dolph Camilli was the RBI leader with 189. Camilli also reached a milestone with 200 RC! The SB leader was Bloomington's Lyn Lary (19 SB, 9 CS ).

The ERA champ was Walla Walla's "Pitcher of the Period" Lefty Grove at 2.04. The victories leader was Walla Walla's Carl Hubbell (25-9). He was joined by teammates Grove (24-4), Harry Kelley (20-5) and Dizzy Dean (20-7). Other 20-game winners included Sioux Falls's duo of Wes Ferrell (22-10) and Tommy Bridges (22-12), as well as Arkansas's Curt Davis (20-5). The Strikeout leader was Chestertown's Van Lingle Mungo with 216 K. The "Fireman of the Year" Arkansas's Dick Coffman (14/21 SVO, 21 RP, 40 GR, 2.33).
