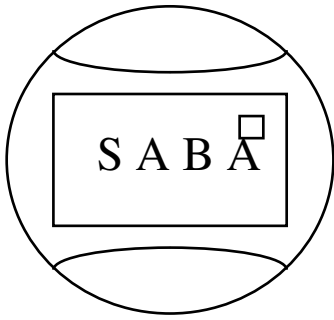
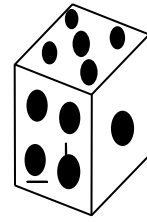

DAWSON, MORRIS, L. SMITH NEW HALL OF FAMERS

Three players were elected to the SABA Hall of Fame this season, Andre Dawson, Jack Morris, and Lee Smith.

Dawson, a slugging outfielder, hit .265 with a .480 slugging percentage over his 16-year career. He spent time with Schuyler, Ybor City, and Red Hook, where he spent his last six years. Dawson hit 438 career homeruns, with a high of 58 in 1987. Six times he hit 30 or more homers, including his last three years. He was an important part of the Schuyler World Championship teams of 1977-1979.

Morris won 232 games in his 16-year career, all with the Wildwood/San Diego franchise. The big righthander won 20 or more games four times, with a high of 28 in 1986. Thirteen times Morris collected double figure wins. His career ERA was 3.66.

Lee Smith was one of the top relief pitchers of his era. During his 15-year career, all with Platte Valley, he pitched in 829 games, saving 229, and picking up 325 relief points. Smith's ERA was 2.62. He ranks first all-time in RP and second in both games pitched and saves. Smith was a vital part of the Barons' World Championships in 1989 and 1991.

Others receiving votes were: Ryne Sandberg 5, Kirby Puckett 4, Alan Trammell 3, Ozzie Smith 2, Don Mattingly 2, Tom Henke 1, and Lou Whitaker 1.

AMERICANS OUTSLUG CAPITOLS 6 - 3

The American Conference jumped out to an early 5-0 lead and then held on to claim another All-Star Game victory over their Capitol Conference brethren, 6-3. The win cut the CC's once seemingly unsurmountable lead to only two games, 25-23.

After the starting pitchers each scored two shutout innings, the trouble started for the CC when Andy Pettitte came on in relief in the third. After walking Travis Fryman and Lance Berkman, Pettitte served up a homerun pitch to Summit's Darin Erstad and the AC led 3-0. They added two more in the 4th when Brian Anderson walked Moises Alou and was relieved by David Wells, who gave up a single to Mark McGwire and a two-run double to Fryman.

Will Clark's two-run homer in the 5th cut the lead to 5-2, but the CC could get no closer. The two teams traded ninth inning runs, the AC's coming on a Carl Everett homer, to make the final 6-3.
