LAWRENCEVILLE JUMPS TO EARLY CAROLINA LEAD

Several clubs have jumped to sizeable leads in their divisions after two months of play, none greater than the Lawrenceville Leatherbacks. The Leatherbacks opened a 7-game lead over second place Carmel-on-the-Sea with a 16-10 month. Lawrenceville is playing at a .625 clip for the season, trailing only Summit and Charleston in the league, while all the other Carolina Division squads are playing less than .500 ball. The Leatherbacks displayed a potent middle-of-the-order led by Manny Ramirez, who hit .307 with nine homers and 23 RBI. Other key bats were Edgar Martinez (.250, 8 HR, 25 RBI), Ryan Klesko (.315, 5 HR, 18 RBI), and Luis Gonzalez (.290, 5 HR, 17 RBI).

Summit maintained a solid lead in the Cornhusker Division, going 18-8 during November. The Antelope got their usual good pitching, led by Randy Johnson, who included two shutouts in his 4-1 month with a 2.37 ERA. Summit also got better than usual slugging behind Player of the Month Darin Erstad (.388, 11 HR, 33 RBI), Jeff Kent (.293, 10 HR, 26 RBI), and Frank Thomas (.307, 9 HR, 21 RBI).

Greenville appears to be the Antelope's number one challenger, although Dixie and Galveston are not far behind. The Spinners had a 17-9 month, due in part to the pitching of Kenny Rogers (4-1, 2.23) and Josias Manzanilo (7 saves, 2.34).

One performance that should also be noted was the 10 saves and 1.59 ERA of Charleston closer, Robb Nen.
