## STALLIONS KNOT CAROLINA DIVISION RACE

The Ocala Stallions took advantage of SABA's longest month, posting a 21-5 record, and tying the Houghton Hosers for the lead in the Carolina Division. Ocala was sustained by its pitching. Stallion pitchers had an ERA of 3.49 compared to the league ERA of 4.83. Only one team had a better November ERA than Ocala (Carolina). Kelvim Escobar (4-0. 2.83 ERA) and Johan Santana (3-1, 3.42 ERA) were the top Stallion starters. Relief ace Mariano Rivera was 4-0 with an 0.51 ERA and nine saves.

Houghton did not fall apart, finishing 16-10. Only two teams, including Ocala, had better November records. Vladimir Guerrero (.306, 6 HR, 29 RBI) and Jimmy Rollins (.340, 3 HR, 21 RBI) were the leading Hoser hitteers. The team hit .250, which was well under the league average of .262.

Houghton's 3.76 ERA exceeded the league ERA of 4.83 by more than a run. Starters Jose Lima and Jake Peavy went 6-1, but the most effective hurler was closer John Smoltz, who went 1-2 with a 1.12 ERA and 11 saves.

The other three division leaders maintained solid leads. Charleston continues to have the League's best overall record at 34-14, followed by Galveston at 33-15.

## HALL OF FAME ADDS TWO MEMBERS

Two new players were elected to the SABA Hall of Fame as the result of recent voting, Wade Boggs and Cal Ripken, Jr. Boggs received 87% of the vote and Ripken received 75%.

Boggs, a thirdbaseman, played 17 SABA seasons, all with Zukey Lake. He hit .328 with 116 homers, 1,296 RBI, and 1,370 runs scored. He had 2,960 hits and collected 585 doubles.

Ripken, a shortstop, played 19 SABA seasons, 15 with Dixie and four with Mudville. He hit .260 with 453 home runs, 1,757 RBI, and 1,582 runs scored. During his first 15 seasons, Ripken Played every game for his team and finished with 2,849 games played.
