CHARLESTON - DIXIE LIKELY MATCHUP?

As SABA rolls into the last quarter of the 2001 season, it appears likely that the World Series will be a matchup between the league's two best teams based on their win-loss records, Charleston and Dixie. The Riverdogs have put together a powerful club that leads the league in almost all the important hitting categories, including batting average, slugging average, on-base average, homeruns, and runs scored. Although not quite as dominant, Charleston has also taken the lead in pitching during the second half of the season with a 3.67 ERA. Dixie has been threatening to capture the league title for several years, but always seemed to be a piece or two short. This may be their year, however, with defending Cornhusker Division champion Summit having a down season.

Veteran slugger Barry Bonds leads a pack of Charleston stars, including Alex Rodriguez and Todd Helton. Bonds is having a spectacular year and is threatening to break some league records. His .859 slugging percentage currently exceeds the league record of .825 set in 1980 by George Brett. He is also setting a pace that would break the record for runs scored, 173 set by Ken Griffey, Jr. in 1994.

In the Carolina Division, Riverside jumped back into first place and now holds a 4-game lead over Oregon and 5 games over Carmel. Evanston increased its lead in the Great Lakes Division to five games, while Green Bay made the biggest move, keeping its hopes alive in the division race and definitely making it a factor in the wild card race.
