DIVISION LEADERS HOLD SERVE

There was no late season excitement in SABA this year, as all four division leaders entering the final month of the season finished strong and retained their advantages. Two teams, Evanston and Dixie, won over 100 games. Only one team, Bayou, lost 100 games and they were exactly on that number. One surprise was that two-time defending league champion Charleston slipped to the third playoff seed. Nevertheless, they should be a strong playoff contender.

The season saw some outstanding offensive performances. Evanston's Albert Pujols led the league in four key categories -- runs, hits, rbi, and doubles -- and tied for second in batting average. After playing second fiddle for most of his career to teammates Barry Bonds and Alex Rodriguez, Todd Helton broke loose and won the batting title with a.366 average.

Houghton returned to the league's elite after a few mediocre campaigns. The Hosers swept to the Carolina Division title, holding off a late charge by Carmel. Houghton had five players with 20 or more homeruns, led by Rafael Palmeiro with 39 and Vlad Guerrero, despite missing 50 games due to injuries, with 34.

Mudville qualified for the playoffs despite a losing record. The Monarchs get the booby prize -- they draw 124-game winner Evanston in the first round.

Four of Evanston's starting pitchers were 20-game winners. Livan Hernandez led the group with 24 victories. The only other pitcher fitting into that crew was Ocala's Roy Halladay with 22 wins. Quite an achievement for a pitcher on a team that had 47 fewer wins than Evanston.
