REDBIRDS EDGE DUCKS FOR CAROLINA CROWN

The Carolina Division race, which has been back-and-forth over the last few months, took an unusual turn during May play. Oregon, which entered the final month with a four-game lead, collapsed with a 7-15 record, tying for the league's worst record. This allowed Riverside to take the division crown despite managing only a .500 record itself. The Ducks went 3-8 on the road and 1-5 at home against Mudville, the best team that missed the playoffs.

Walled Lake also sputtered down the stretch, going 8-14, but still won the Great Lakes Division, although with only a .500 record. The Walleyes' flop allowed Evanston to make a late run at the title, but they fell three games short.

Galveston and Platte Valley entered the month tied for the last wildcard spot. The Grey Sox won their head-to-head series with the Barons 3-2, but stumbled elsewhere, allowing Platte Valley to edge them out by one game, despite a mere .500 record. The Barons' reward? A first round playoff meeting with top seed Charleston.

The Riverdogs maintained their slim one-game lead over Summit for the first seed. Charleston's 108 wins was the best record in the league. The Riverdogs were all over the batting leader boards. Barry Bonds was first in the league in batting average (.346), slugging percentage (.807), and on-base average (.502). He was second to teammate Alex Rodriguez in homeruns and runs scored, and third to teammates Rodriguez and Todd Helton in RBI.

RULES CHANGE PROPOSALS

(This is not a vote, but a chance for SABAns to comment on the proposals, pro and con)

From Mike Landin:

Ignore all injuries. (SABA already forces players to be rested, so injuries are not needed.)

From Parris Foxworthy:

Digital Cards:

I would like to suggest providing the SABA player cards digitally. Via excel, etc. Another interesting side note to this is access to the cards to make copies (from APBAgo) is cheaper than the league fees that are currently charged.

League Constriction:

With several current teams without managers, I would like to suggest eliminating a minimum of two teams with players distributed by a dispersal draft or just added to the 2003 draft list. This would provide a more stable manager base and provide a much more balanced and easier to manage schedule.

Revamp Stat Comp:

I would like to adjust the series stat comp to add additional stats and a stat comparison that would automatically make sure the series stats are balanced. It would be a instant check and make it easier to process seasonal stats.

In addition, I would also like to provide a seasonal stat comp for each team that would provide easier access to seasonal stats, home and away splits and provide an automatic player limit adjustment feature.

Pre-draft cutting process (10-round draft):

At a certain set date before the draft, each team is required to cut to a 22-player roster with released players going into the next rookie / free agent draft. This "22" player limit will automatically adjust to account for the number of draft picks the team holds heading into the draft. For example, if the team has it's own 10 picks, they must adjust the roster to 22 players. If a team trades 3 players for 3 additional draft picks, their roster must be adjusted to 19 players before the draft (19+10+3=32), etc.

(Players + number of draft picks) must = 32.

I believe this will provide a bit more balance to the league, keeping teams from 'hoarding' quality players that are then cut after the draft with no chance of other teams claiming such players to fill a possible need.
