The **Toxic Waste River Rats** went 22-8 in May and have built up an early 12-game lead over **Gehrig Division** rival **Burleigh**. The **Toxins** actually lost two series, one to **Duluth** at home and one to **Madison** on the road, but had three 5-0 sweeps! The **Toxins** lead the TML in offense (2nd in AVG and 1st in Runs scored), while posting the 2nd best team ERA, thanks to a stellar bullpen. Will the bullpen last the season?!

Elsewhere in the Atmospheric Conference, Gatto leader Santa Ana (12-18 for the month) had a losing month, but took over first place from Beverly (9-21) by 1 game. In the Robinson, Madison (20-10) is still in 1st place, with Duluth (20-10) lingering at 2 games behind and Glenmont (19-11) now 3 out. Vanderlyle (21-9) had a fine month.

Over in the Oceanic Conference, Danny Way Diamonds also went 20-10 in May, but lost a little ground to Perth (22-8), now only 3 games off the pace! In the Steinmetz, Albany (21-9) gained some ground on Mudville (17-13) and now leads by 5 games. In the Williams, Rocky Mountain (15-15) had a .500 month, but it was good enough to take over the lead. Marco Island (14-16) is now 3 behind and Lake Wobegone (11-19) has dropped to 4 games back.

The new batting leader is **Glenmont's** "Player of the Month" Mitch Haniger with an impressive .395 average! Madison's Jose Altuve is a distant 2nd at .348. Kentucky's Mookie Betts still leads in SB (15/22).

The new ERA leader is **Danny Way's** "Pitcher of the Month" Mike Mikolas at 1.55. Beverly's Mike Foltynewicz is 2nd at 2.05. There is a 3-way tie in victories between **Danny Way's Gerrit Cole** (8-2) and **Toxic Waste's** pair of **Jon Gray** (8-2) and reliever **Tony Sipp** (8-0). Five other pitchers have 7 victories. The new Strikeout leader is **Perth's**

Justin Verlander, with 117 K. The new Saves leader is Rocky Mountain's Cody Allen (17/20 in SVO, 3.16).
