The early ERA leader is California's "Pitcher of the Month" Wade Miley at 1.22. Homestead's Aaron Nola is the victories leader at 5-1. Toxic Waste's Spencer Strider leads in Strikeouts with 55 K. The early Saves leader is Kentucky's David Bednar (8/9 in 10 GR, 0.66 ERA).
