TML 7 was a rather placid year. The greatest controversies were surrounding protests. After not having any in the previous 6 years, 7 brought a barrage. I sometimes feel that there is some point in every game that a manager playing the games with instructions has to make some decision (based on those instructions) that he would not make himself. However, the instructions say to do otherwise.

Admittedly most of us say in the instructions that if something makes good baseball sense, then do it! As Co-Grand Poobah of this league, the most unpleasant duties I have to perform are expulsion (done once) and to decide protests. Let's face it, it's a no-win situation. However, as the Bard of Commack has stated, "One dost not protest, whilst there be no cause". In essence, the truth.

The major news of the year was the fact that no less than 7 no-hitters were tossed in the League this year – 6 in the National. The no-hit artists were: Andy McGaffigan of Ozark, Joe Niekro of Commack, Tom Seaver of Pensacola (This one is sometimes forgotten as he took it into the 11th before losing the no-hitter and the game.), Phil Niekro of Mohawk Trail, Rick Reuschel of UConn, Kurt Kepshire of Rainier, and Tom Browning of Kentucky. We lost quite a few managers this season. Every loss hurt, but the new managers that we gained were all fine people. Managers who left this season were: Gerry Klug of Westfield who built his team into the Divisional Champion, and may return (hopefully) in the future, Lowell Baumunk of Denver, and three charter managers: Mike Moore of Uconn, Tim Muledy of Addison, and Dick

Gorney of Harbor Beach. Mike inherited either the worst or second-worst TML team just into our first season and the rest is history. If you look further in this book at the career managerial records, Mike Moore's name appears almost at the very top of the list. He's at the top of the list as a person also. I met Tim 6 years ago in Chicago and really enjoyed the experience. I've never met Dick, but have been in leagues with him for the past 10 years. All were exceptional TML'ers. All were fair, honest, and will be missed by all who came in contact with them.

Expansion became less of an issue, in fact it's not an issue due to the need to replace so many managers. We are lucky in that we were able to draw 5 solid names off of the Associate list. Logically, we are in need of good associates. Admittedly, they may have to wait a year or so to get into the League, but patience is always rewarded in the TML.

The Free Agent weekend was impaired by a shot of bad weather and balanced by record attendance. It was a weekend to tell stories with not too many all-nighters. I missed Cohoes to Loudonville. Although the weekend was a quiet one, it was soothing to see my old friends again.





American '86-A Review

Sporting one of the most exciting finishes in TML history, the American Association (AA) had quite a season in TML VII. Two division titles and one wild-card spot weren't decided until after the season was over! TML VII did however, see an end to our three year reign as having the TML champion, since in the finals Coldwater lost in 5. Nevertheless it was an exciting season, so let's get on with the season in review.

Larry Rumsey's Coldwater Lakers became the new AA champion, downing Rockford and New Jersey each in 5 games. The Lakers won their division by the largest margin of the four division winners, 9 games, and achieved the best record in the conference. It was also Coldwater's first trip to post-season play. Two twenty game winners (Petry and Moore) led the staff, while the Lakers balanced offense led the conference in runs scored. Coldwater had only two players among any batting leaders, Gedman in batting average (9th) and Barfield in home runs (5th). By the way, the Lakers finished last the year before.

Wakefield (along with Chicago) tied for most frustrating season. The Cardinals needed to win only one(!) of their last four games to make the playoffs, and couldn't do it. Despite Tudor's 20 wins, the pitching was disappointing. The Cards low batting average was compensated somewhat by leading the league in walks. Colonie also fell just short, an event which led to their manager entering the Hall of Biff (joining someone very close to me). The Flames deep bullpen led the league in saves and relief points, but the offense needed more than just Tim Raines. Raines was among the top ten in batting average, doubles, triples, runs, hits, slugging, stolen bases, walks, on-base, and runs created (whew!). Hudson finished fourth for the second year in a row. The lack of a .300 hitter and a stopper were just part of another tough year. Willie Wilson's 22 triples tied for second on the all-time AA list. After ruling the Mays for three years, Toledo sank to the bottom. Rickey Henderson provided plenty of excitement though, leading the league in walks, on-base (.517 setting a TML record), and runs created. Toledo's 254 stolen bases also set a new AA mark.

After a tight three team race through series 10, Dick Gorney's Harbor Beach Hurons pulled away to win the Banks. Stieb's 20 wins led a solid rotation, while both Niedenfuer and Cliburn accumulated over 20 saves. Defense also helped the Hurons, leading the conference in turning double plays. Statistically Rockford had no business making the playoffs, but did anyway. McGee (.346) stood out on offense, but it was the Radar's depth which provided the edge. By series five 16 different players had game-winning hits, and 8 different pitchers had saves. Curiously, the Radar set a TML record in walks allowed (700). It was also Rockford's first trip to the playoffs. By the way, the OFFICIAL number of times I was eliminated was 30 (for details on this irrelevent stat, see Eric Rogers).

Chicago joined Wakefield for the frustration prize, as a .500 mark in series 12 would have put the Bruins in the playoffs. Chicago was 2nd in the league in batting average, and second in the league in ERA, but still missed out. The Bruins were however, 18th in walks and undoubtadly first in GIDP's, which probably resulted in their third place finish. Addison fell to fourth after 2 years at the top. Hough won 20 while Lee Smith's 33 relief points led the division. Guerrero (42 HR's,115 RBI's,.325) had his best season for the Arrows. Banff limped home in the cellar, the only ballclub in the division to finish below .500. The worst pitching in the division was too much for the Biffs respectable offense to overcome. Viola had 19 wins with 4 starts to go, but couldn't get number 20. Banff played a critical role in determining the playoff spots, beating Colonie during the season and stunning Chicago in series 12.

American Continued

The two best records in the AA were held in the Musial, as Mike Landin's Darkfyre Daemons survived a late surge by Rich Perrotti's wild card New Jersey Pinstripers. The Daemons boasted two 20-game winners (and one with 19 wins) and one of two AA pitchers to accumulate 30 saves. At the plate 5 players blasted in excess of 20 home runs. The combination led to the 4th best offense in runs scored and the 3rd best ERA. Although the Daemons had best record, they didn't win 100 games, and were eliminated by New Jersey in the playoffs. The Pinstripers missed the divisional title by one game, but did have the second best record in the league. Again, power and pitching led the way. Gooden led a phenomenal staff which topped the league in ERA, while on offense 6 players hit 22 or more home runs. Gooden set AA all-time records in ERA, wins, shutouts, and complete games.

Sir Jeffrey finished above .500, but ended the season well behind the top two teams. The Silver Knights offense keyed on the stolen base, with Coleman's 138 steals missing the league record by 7. Cox just missed 20 wins. Salt River dropped from its familiar second place perch, finishing fourth. It was the first time in 3 years the Stompers did not lead the league in ERA. Zagazig ended the season in the cellar for the third consecutive year (and my guess is also the last, for a while anyway). The Zilches did led the league in their traditional stat however, collecting 64 successful bunts. Garrelts 40 relief points figured in almost 60% of Zagazig's wins.

The Koufax also sported a three team race, with Mark Hetterich's Pensacola Stingray pulling out the division by one game. The Stingray boasted the best team batting average in the league, led by Boggs at .389. Not only did Boggs win the batting crown, but he also set an AA record for hits with 254. The staff was balanced, with three pitchers winning 18 or more games. Pensacola scored more runs than any other team in the league.

L&M continued its offensive display, with the second best attack in the league. Unfortunately for the Librae, this year it wasn't enough. Six players cracked 21 or more homers, and three players scored over 100 runs. Quisenberry's 30 saves tied for the league lead, but overall the pitching was not quite good enough. Philadelphia had their best season ever, but 90 wins was good for only 3rd in the division. The Blue Jays led the league in doubles, with Mattingly (50) and Herr (43) 2nd and 3rd in the league respectively. Philadelphia had a number of "big names" in their lineup, but the offense was somewhat disappointing. After making the playoffs last year, Sherlock barely avoided 100 losses. McCaskill (1-15,7.09) had to have one of the worst years in TML history. The C's staff was dead last in ERA, and a league leading 215 team home runs couldn't bail out the struggling rotation. With the strong offenses in the division, Pacific was in for a long year. Having the worst offense in the league didn't help. On top of that, the Goldeyes led the league in home runs allowed. Browning alone gave up a whopping 51 taters. I wonder if he has a sprained neck.

The future continues to look exciting for the AA. In the Koufax L&M's offense may be the best ever, but Philadelphia looks good. Darkfyre and Zagazig will fight in the Musial, which should see the lowest winning percentage for a division winner. Colonie holds the edge in the Mays, but don't count out Wakefield. Finally, another three team race (Baskerville, Rockford, and Chicago) is setting up in the Banks.

This is my last article for the American Game. I am staying in the league, but am moving to Omaha in the summer. It's easier for everyone if I turn it over to Mike Short. I've enjoyed writing this the past four years, and look forward to meeting more league members in the future. Good luck Mike! And, good luck to all in TML VIII.

After C.Johnson walked, Armas rapped out a 2-RBI single, giving Mohawk Trail a big 4-run 1st inning. in the Coldwater 2nd, Almon banged out a 2-run homer. Rawley coasted through the 5th and was replaced by Henke in the 6th. After fanning the first two batters in the CL 7th, Henke served up a homer to Almon, his 2nd of the game, to make the score 4-3 MT. Jay Howell ended the threat. Meanwhile, Mohawk Trail was putting runners on base in every inning after the 1st, but could not get a key hit. (MT left 16 men on base in the game!) It could have made a difference, but Coldwater just could not solve the Avenger pitching staff. SOME CLOSING COMMENTS: The Mohawk Trail Avengers tied for best record in the TML this season, going 101-59. The pitching staff nearly had three 20-game winners and the bullpen was outstanding. The Avenger offense was one of the best in the league and their "Golden Glove" defense was the best. In the playoffs, their only tough fight came in the National finals against Uconn and even then, they had held a 3 games to 1 advantage before wrapping it up in Game \$7. The Avengers set a team record for highest batting average in a TML World Series, with .318, and lowest ERA with 1.84. Even with all the stars on the team, the Avenger "Hero" had to be World Series MVP, Willie McGee, who through the 17 post season games put together the following stats: .413, 31 Hits, 18 Runs, 10 RRIs, 1 2B, 4 3Bs, & 4 HRs. For the Coldwater Lakers, the World Series had to be a big disappointment. The Lakers more or less cruised to their division title and won the American pennant by taking both playoffs 4 games to 1. Then, in the Series, the Coldwater bats went silent to the tune of anemic .156, also a TML World Series record. Despite the lack of hitting, the Lakers still only lost the final two games by scores of 2-1 & 4-3. Oh well, wait till next year.

The Third Memorial TML no-Star Game was held somewhere in the jungles of Micaragua, as the Managers awaited payment by laundered Iranian money.

The Americans scored first on a Ron Cey triple and a Jody Davis RBI-single. Then, the Tom Brunansky "How Not To Throw a Baseball Clinic" began. Steve Balboni drove home Frank White from 1st on a double to right, on which Brunansky threm a 24-hopper to 1st base. In the 3rd.
