Bryag Sakolaky's Walla Walla Wombats captured the first Williams Division championship on the swift heals of Rickey Henderson, and solid erformances by Bobby Bonilla and Julio Franco. Henderson stole 104 bases, while only caught 16 times. His ability to get himself around the bases contributed to 128 runs scored. Usually it was Bonilla (111 RBIs) or Franco (110 RBIs) driving him in. The pitching was led by 19-game winner Jose DeLeon and Dennis Martinez's 18 wins. The pen chalked up 38 saves behind the one-two punch of Dong Jones (17 saves, 2.23) and Les Lancaster (15 saves, 1.64). The Wombets parlayed their playoff appearance into an American Association Championahip by defeating Philadelphia in seven games, winning the last four against Colonie to take the series 4-2, and bumping off regular season champion Sherlock to face the New York Woodchoppers in the TML World Series. The charm continued for the Wombats in the World Series, as Walla Walla defeated New York four games to one. The Record Book: The Wombet's 62 errors represent the fewest miscues ever by a TML team. Wombat Wisdom: Walla Walla, with 93 wins had the poorest record of any American playoff team, yet won the Association Championship and the World Series

The Rockford Radar stumbled badly coming out of the starting gate, but a hot summer stretch Tom Kopp's team in aniffing distance of the frontrunner. A potent offense was offset by disappointing pitching, as the Radar were among the top five in runs scored, and the bottom five in runs allowed. Basically, a lot of runs were scored in Radar games. Ryne Sandberg made the offense go, leading the team in home runs (26) and RBIs (111), and driving in the winning run 18 times to lead the American. Losnie Smith popped 25 home runs and drove in 97 Redermen, while Barry Boads scored 109 times despite a .312 on-base percentage. On the mound side, the results were more disappointing, especially Mitch "Wild Thang Williams, on route to a 2-9 record and a 6.23 BRA. Bill Landrum was much more reliable, chipping in at 2.49 with 18 saves. Opponents hit .272 with 158 home runs against the Radar. Radar Racket: Mitch Williams walked 8.7 betters every 9

The Zagarig Zikhes could not find caough help for Reuben Sierra to compete for Manager Bob Weisman. Sierra was terrific, playing all 160 games, and driving in 104 runs on the strength of 27 homers, not to mention an association-leading 18 triples. But he alugged nearly 130 points better than the rest of the team, and Zagazig could not put 600 runs on the board. Tom Henke and Gregg Olson were very difficult to score on once the game got into late innings, both posting BRAs under 2.00. Henke collected 28 saves, and Olson added 11. The starters were largely

an indifferent bunch in 1990, though Ken Howell did lead the team in wins with a 13-8 record. The Record Book: The Zilches turned the fewest double plays in TML history with 90 twin killings. Zilch Mulch: Perhaps appropriate in the Bgyptian heat, the Zilches led the Association in air-conditioning, whiffing 1062 times. The pitching staff was second in atrikeouts, returning the favor 1053 times.

John Gatto's Chicago Brains just didn't have enough of anything to compete. The team's .356 slugging percentage and .310 on-base percentage were among the lowest in the American, and the result was not enough runs for Bruin pitchers. Mark Grace led the Bruins in most offensive categories, including runs (81), RBIs (80) and homers (18). Grace walked 73 times, the only Bruin over 40 in that category. The starting pitching was fairly good in terms of carned runs, but the bullpen had trouble shutting the door, as Tim Burke saved 17 games and won 12, but also dropped ten decisions. Typically, a closer with 22 decisions is not doing the job (compare with association save leader Mark Davis, who had only 10 decisions at 7-3). Bruin Bits: Orel Hershiser led all American pitchers in complete games with 24. It is probably not his fault that 20 of his 31 docinion were losses

The Banff Biffs may have turned the corner for Manager Bric Rogers in 1990. Banff's best team could play with anyone, and the Biff manager took great relish in beating up on the big boys several times early in the year. The trouble was depth and durability, as only three regulars ere able to play in as many as 150 games. Will Clark had a stellar year at first base, leading Banff with 22 home runs and \$1 RBIs, as well as acoring 93 times. Refact Palmeiro also scored 90 times. The pitching was weaker, as only Frank Viola among the starters throw for an ERA under 3.25. Rob Murphy and Mike Jackson shared the limelight most often, tying with Chuck Crim (NJ) for the Association lead in appearances. The Record Book: Banff set the American record for least stolen bases, with only 37, which would place them minth on the individual steals list in 1990. Biffing with the Biffix Not only did the Biffs not steal bases, they were the only team to get nailed more often than they were successful, which may account for their unwillingness to "break for eccord.

The Sherlock C's combination of pitching and power proved too much for most American foes, as Carl Carpenter's powerhouse grabbed the Ruth Division Championship in 1990. The C's, leading the league in home runs with 199, captured 110 wins to take the Association's best record easily. Sherlock used the long ball to score an Association leading 876 runs. They won the division by 11 games. Howard Johnson and Kirby Puckett

provided most of the fire-power and excitement. Johnson put up MVP style sumbars with 154 rans, 42 komers, 116 RBIs and 41 stolen bases. Puckett contributed 122 russ and 53 doubles, while hitting .356, the top average in the American. The team hit .288 and slugged A63. But the offense is only half the story. Paced by Chris Bosio (23-6, 2.83), the C's team BRA landed just below the 3.00 mark. Five starton won at least 15 games, including Chuck Pinley, who joins Bosio at 20 or more. Jeff Mostgomery slammed the door late in the game, with 34 saves. Sherlock defeated Niceville to win the Western Conference Championship. The Record Book: Kirby Puckett tied the American record for hits in a season, first set by Wade Boggs (PS) in TML 7, with 254. C Stuff: Howard Johnson posted the second 40/40 season (40 homers and 40 steals), joining himself in the TML's loneliest club.

Craig Christmann's Los Augeles Spiders put up outstanding offensive sumbers, and combined that with a tough pitching staff to mark up 99 wins. Particularly remarkable was the Spider infield of Von Hayes, Whitaker, Ripken, and Boggs, each of whom scored and drove in at least 90 runs, led by Whitaker's 102 RBIs and Boggs 102 runs. Paced by this foursome, the Spiders pushed 822 runs across the plate. On the pitching side, the staff was anchored by the outstanding performance of Mark Gubicza, who led the Association in wins and winning percentage at 26-6, and innings with 291. Danny Darwin was a force out of the bullpon, winning 5 and saving 14 while osting a 1.86 BRA. The Record Book: The Spiders drew more welks than any team in American history, with 719. Spider Wobs: Los Angeles' Jimmy Key walked the fewest batters per nine innings

in the American, only 1.8.

The Wakefield Cardinals lost manager Jim Clayman half way through the year, but it did not keep the team from post some pretty remarkable numbers. The Cardinals were accord in hitting with a .275 mark and posted over 700 rams, sixth in the Association, this for a team that finished 10 games under .500. They managed that on the lack of strength of the pitching corps, who placed them sixth from the bottom in BRA at 4.33. Ron Darling tied for the lead in gophers allowed at 36, and only one starter was ander 4.00. Rick Honeycutt and Roger McDowell split the saves, but McDowell's BRA was over 5.00. Tom Brunansky drove in 103 runs, and Brett Butler and Steve Sax each scored over 100 times. Cardinal Comments: Consistency was not Wakefield's watchword, as they posted the longest winning streak (10) and fourth longest losing streak (8) during the sesson.

Larry Rumsey's Coldwater Lakers had the opposite kind of year from Wakefield, though they posted the same result (75-85). The Lakers did it with

pitching and no offense. Jesse Barfield led the team with 78 RBIs and only Roberto Alomar scored over 70 runs, all on the strength of the Association's most anemic alugging percentage (.333). The pitching was excellent, however. Mike Moore posted a 20-7 record with a 2.33 ERA, and Bob Milacki split (more or less) 33 decisions with a 3.56 ERA. Stove Bedrosian saved 23 games. The Record Book: The Lakers hit the fewest home runs in TML history when only 66 balls left the yard. Not surprisingly, they also set the American record for lowest alugging percentage at .333. Laker Lip: Mike Moore handcuffed his opponents nine times to lead Association pitchers in abnorate.

Les Ploming's Sir Jeffery Silver Enights simply could not get people out. A weak defense coupled with a poor itching staff yielded a whole lot of runs, 100 runs more than the second weakest team, Pensacola. Knight opponents collected 300 more hits than innings, while picking up over 600 walks and amashing 171 home runs. It wasn't simply the rarified air in the home park, because the Knights did not score 600 times. This despite Bo Jackson (Bo knows dice) who clouted 34 homers and drove in 92 runs. Only Ozzie Smith could score as often as 80 times. The Record Book: The Silver Knights were gallant indeed, chivalrously yielding more runs and more carned runs per nine innings than any team in American history with 926 runs allowed and a team BRA of 5.39. Coincidently, the Knights (and New Jersey) set the American record for fewest complete games. Knight News: The recidivist Knights swiped 214 bases in 1990, leading the Association

The Colonic Flames stormed from behind to take the first Gehrig Division crown, beating out a solid Philadelphia equad by five games, much to the pleasant surprise of Manager Mike Short. The Plames posted their second best season ever. The Flames pitching and defense proved very stingy indeed. Tom Candiotti led all American starters with an BRA of 2.11, and Nolan Ryan, at 2.88, had the highest BRA among the four starters with 30 or more games. In the pen, Davis, Thigpen, Stanton and Lamp all had ERAs under 2.00. While the starters were tough, the pen won 33 games, while losing only 13, and saved 50 games, led by Mark Davis with 37. Kevin Mitchell led a rather anomic offense with 45 homers, 96 RBIs and 109 runs. Tim Raines stole 53 bases to provide some speed, but besically the team relied on its ability to keep other teams away from home plate. The Record Book: Colonic set several American team pitching records, including Lowest BRA (2.63) and Most Shutouts (24). They also get marks for Least Runs (483), and Least Barned Runs (427), despite leading the Association in innings pitched. Nolan Ryan set an individual TML mark by striking out 12.18 betters every 9 innings. Flame Facts: Colonie became the only team in the TML to strike out 1000 opponents in each of the last five years.

The Philadelphia Blue Jays kept manager Joe Steinmetz excited all year. Fast out of the gate, the Jays held sway in the Gehrig all year before stumbling a little at the end. Still, with 99 wins, they qualified for the Global Conference Wildcard. The Jays did it on the strength of Don Mattingly (.295,21,100) and Paul

Molitor (105 runs), combined with a pitching staff among the top five in stinginess. Bryn Smith had a sensational year, posting a 21-5 record combined with an BRA of 2.16, good enough for second in the Association. Roger Clemens and Bob Welch won 18 apiece while Scott Bankhead checked in with 17 wins. Jaya Chatter: Except for Shericck, ao team got more wins out of their top four starters than Philadelphia, whose acce posted a 74-37 record (.667).

To hear about it, the Darkfyre Decreoss had a terrible year. There is no denying that on paper, Mike Leadin's team looked like the one to beat in the Gebrig. But something about chemistry, or the dice, or something conspired to hold this team to "only" 90 wins. Robin Yount was not the reason why. The trade which brought the Player of the Year candidate to the Deemons brought in 22 home runs and 103 RBIs from a player who appeared in every game. Yount accred more than any other Daemon as well, 92 times in all. Bart Blylovez did his part to pull the team to the top, posting a 2.60 ERA and a 21-5 record. But the real story is the second string pon, Randy Myers and Greg Minton, who conspired to drop 14 games between them. Deemon Declarations: Dennis Eckeralcy walked 33% too many men in 1990. That's right, he walked four in 49 plus innings. Sometimes nothing goes right.

For Bill Graham and the Baskerville Hounds, the season resembled the story of Jokyll and Hydo. The Hounds sprang out of the gate, dropping would-be contenders in their wake. But a mid-sesson batting alump that lasted till the end of the sesson put to rest any hopes of post-sesson glory. Though Fred McGriff led the team in most offensive categories (79 runs, 73 RBIs, 27 homers, 110 walks), he just didn't live up to expectations. And the Hounds really needed a top performance from McGriff. The pitching was not spectacular, but strong performances by Dave Steib (2.83, 15-13) and Dave Righetti (26 saves) had their redeeming value. Hound Howls: Baskerville, along with Sir Jeffery, got the most out of their offense, scoring 1.04 runs per run created (if you believe in all that stuff). Only Sherlock and Tuscaloosa, at 1.01, were also over 1.00.

It was a long year for Rich Perrotti and the New Jersey Pinstripers. Joe Carter (33 homers) and Gary Gaetti (26 homers) effered some power, but the team was seldem on base (301) to be driven in. On the other hand, the pitching staff was constantly putting people on base, giving ap 2153 bearanners in 1418.2 innings. Al Leiter had the misfortuse of sharing the Association mark for lesses at 8-22. Pinstripe Points: New Jersey gave up fewer home runs per better faced than any team in the American. Only Colonie gave up fewer home runs, and the Flames faced about 400 fewer batters.

The Niceville Samurai, backed by 20 game winners Bret Saberhagen and Dong Drabek, coasted to the first Robinson crown, as Bill Jelka piloted his team to the only blowout this year, winning by over 15 games. Lary Andersen's 33 saves sealed the fate of Niceville opponents, preserving wins for a staff that saw all five starters

win at least 14 games. Porty-one complete games showed that Anderson was often not second. The pitching was the closest to a finesse staff, as the Samurai were the only division winner without 1000 strikeouts. Nick Bassky put up dizzying numbers with 30 home runs and 114 RBIs. Ivan Calderon's speed and power (67 extra base hits) and Jack Clark's eye (146 walks) supported a belanced offense that scored 76k times. The Record Book: Jack Clark set an American record for walks with 146. Niceville Nuggets. Niceville defeated Los Angeles four games to two in the Western Conference wildcard contest.

The Tuscaloosa Crimson Tide guaranteed many high-acering games for sanager Ralph Geiger, as a high-powered offense, responsible for 749 rans, and a low-power pitching staff, responsible for 743 rans, led to several high-scoring games. Remarkably, the offense was a team effort. Hrbek led the team with 78 RBIs, and Robby Thompson's 90 runs was far and away the best. Jeff Russell was virtually unhittable out of the pen, with a 1.29 BRA and only 3 homers allowed in 62 ranings. This led to 7 wins and 29 saves. Tide Tales: Dan Gladden was second only to Milt Thompson (NS) with 12 outfield errors. Thompson had 14.

The Suncoast Suns underwent a change of management midyear, with Hank Pedicone replacing Dong Tobey. The results didn't change much; the team remained right around .500. Balanced power offensively help the Suns acore reasonably often. Six players had ten or more homers, led by Pedro Guerrero and Jeff Leonard with 20. In the final analysis, the Sun pitchers were just too generous: only Sir Jeffery opponents hit at a higher batting average (280). Sun Consting: Sun pitchers struck out fewer batters than any other team, the only American team under 700 whiffs.

For Brandon Rose and the Flin Flon Diamond Kings, "wait'll next year" started early. And with the financial problems plaguing the team, it may be a while before the Kings surface as contenders. Kings led the Association in several dubious categories: Andres Galarraga in strikeouts (as a batter: 159), and Doyle Alexander is losses, hits allowed and home runs given up. Flin Flights of Paney: Gary Thurman did the impossible: he led the Association in steals, despite butting only 104 times.

Mark Hetterich had the misfortune to watch his Ponsacola Stingrays achieve the worst record in the American at 49-111. What was remarkable about the Rays was how they did it, dropping 19 home games in a row at one point, getting swept by Wakefield with contingency rales, and losing 23 out of 24 games to division pertners at home, until getting into a doglight with Niceville at the end of the scason. Ironically, the 19 game losing streak was broken against Colonic, who ed the second best record in the American this year. Gregg Jefferies was the bright spot, the only Ray to drive in and acore as many as 70 runs. Bobby Witt actually had a worse record than Al Leiter at 5-22. Sting Ray Stingers: To the best of my ability to research it, I believe Pete Smith is only the second pitcher in American history to give up over 200 runs. (The first was Bell of Pensacola during the 1988 ecasog).

The New York squad boasted a record-setting pitching staff, having set a TML record lowest single season ERA of 2.43. Every New York starter had ERA's below 3.00 and all their relievers were below 2.00. Offensively, the New Yorkers hit .291, led by the National Player of the Year, Ruben Sierra. Statistically, Walla Walla did not have matching numbers, as their team ERA was 3.29 and the team batted .268. This was more of a team effort, as individuals contributed as needed. One strong point of Walla Walla was their defense, having set a TML single season record for fewest errors (62). In the Series, Walla Walla did not make an error and the "team" factor weighed heavily in their Championship drive.
