The American Game

with Mike Short

The year 1991 will go down as one of the strangest in American Association History.

First, American Commissioner Mike Landin stepped aside for a year. He had had enough of the enforcer role, and a team that was underperforming, and a game that took a long time to play. Jim Pertierra talked him into taking a break for a while, so he could refresh his enjoyment of the league.

Then, Tom Kopp swore off dice, insisting he was a much finer general manager and never was that lucky anyway. So he hired his brother Mike to roll the dice and pilot the team.

Then, Sherlock manager Carl Carpenter stepped down, and Jim took over (though you would never know it from the American articles in the Summer Stretch).

Then, the manager for Tougaloo became a no-show, and the franchise was picked up by at least three other managers: Jim, our erstwhile on-sabbatical co-commissioner Mike, and the current Tougaloo manager Mark Plate.

Somewhere along the line, the Flin Flon spot became open, and Mike picked up managerial duties there.

Then Lonnie Buys disappeared, moving, losing his phone and basically incommunicado. So Mike, having just disposed of the Flin Flon schedule, picked up his old team and guided them into position to win the division. And didn't. But more on that later. Of course, Lonnie resurfaced, and had actually played some games that Mike had replayed, although he didn't know he was replaying them,

since he thought they'd never been played, which they had been.

A lot of the season is a blur for this reporter, a blur of computer syntax error messages. I spent most of the summer scrambling to get an early version of the computer game Diamond Dreams ready before each bonus date so I could cram the games in, and rip the program apart again for the next three weeks. It's not as if I lived and breathed the game, but I did take a set of disks with me on vacation, where I added the arrow selection of the runners to pinch run for, and the arrow selection of what base to throw to (you used to have to type it in, though only four or five of you saw the game like that). I may have done most of the lineup selection stuff on vacation, too. Some vacation.

And some season. Sherlock, with its new interim manager Jim, battled Los Angeles, managed by Craig Christmann to a flatfooted tie atop the Association with a Ruthian 103 wins. The two has split 16 games head to head, so it went to assorted tie breakers, and the Spiders were elected to visit the Pensacola Sting Rays, who under the watchful eye of pilot Mark Hetterich had compiled 100 wins to swamp the Robinson. The Spiders took the first two games at Pensacola, but returned the favor twice at home to return the series to Florida with a 3-2 lead. But the Sting Rays turned back the Spiders to win the series in seven games.

Across the way, three other noble teams (four, actually) battled all year long for bragging rights in the Global Conference. Bryan Sakolsky's Walla Walla Wombats ended up

with the best record in the conference with 101 wins and a three game cushion over the Kopp Brother's Rockford Radar to will the Williams division. And in the Gerhig. Lonnie/Mike's Darkfyre Daemons closed like wild fire, passing Colonie and posting a large enough lead that only a 14-2 final series record or better could thwart them. So Mike Short's Colonie Flames ignited, winning 14 straight and 15 of 16 to leave Drakfyre with the best non-playoff record for the second straight year. In fact, only Darkfyre and the playoff teams had records better than .500. Gerry Klug and the Molly Pitchers finished at 80-80 for the eighth best record in the Association.

I had the good fortune to watch the Flames fight tooth and nail in the Global Wildcard Playoff, taking a 3-2 lead in games only to lose 3-1 in games six and surrender back-to-back-to-back-to-back-to-back (yes four) homeruns in game seven. In the finest Dennis Gaige tradition, I ripped the disk from the machine and tossed it into the fire. Since the game was stored on the harddrive, the action was largely ceremonial.

In keeping with the spirit of the season, Mike Short then picked up the managerial duties of both Walla Walla and Pensacola in the playoffs. First, he proved that he could lose with anyone's team as he piloted the Rays to a 4-2 loss with Jim's Sherlock. Then he proved he could actually predict a series and have it come out right when he suggested that Rockford had underestimated Walla Walla. Of course, this being 1991, Mike Landin managed Rockford (both against Colonie and against Walla Walla). The

Wombats womped them, four games to one.

The final American Series of the year pitted Byran/Mike's Wombats against Carl/Jim's C's for the honor of being swept by Rocky Hall in the World Series. And it was a nailbiter, with six close games, four of them Walla Walla wins.

The most important event in the American in 1991, however, was not the playing of the games, but the ability to play some games on the computer. For a while during the season, the league had only 37 managers, and Jim playing games in the American and the National (altogether about 236 league games -- he's the only human who has used the Diamond Dreams draft program more that I). Now, we have 40 managers, plus eight expansion managers, plus a waiting list, plus another league with the 1964 card set. More than one manager (and I think this included two commissioners) told me in March of 1991 that the Diamond Dreams Baseball-(TM) computer game (as yet unnamed) would be the savior of the TML. I remember clearly what I thought when I heard that: Oh Thanks! As if I don't have enough pressure as it is!

But things have worked out very well. The company's had some growing pains; this is new to us, trying to support a computer system on several different hardware types spread all across the country. On paper, you can print a correction, change the rules, fix a rating. At my job, I can call up the program, make the change, file it away and it's fixed. But when the rating is on your computer in Tuscaloosa, I can't run down the hall and fix it; when it's not on paper, you can't just say "David Justice's error number should be a four." But we'll get better.

And the support Dimaond Dreams has had from the TML league memebers has made it all possible. And that is what I will remember from 1991.

For Mike Landin and Darkfye, it will likely be remembering falling just short and wondering what might have been if he'd been at the helm all year.

For Bill Graham and Thunder Bay, it might be wondering what would have happened if the offense had shown up.

For Joe Steinmetz and Philadelphia, perhaps it will be Clemens and Welch each winning 18 games.

For Rich Perrotti and New Jersey, perhaps the battle cry of "Wait till next year" sounded in April.

For Bryan Sakolsky and Walla Walla, it will be another American Championship.

For the Kopps and Rockford, a wonderful season with one tough set of Three Amigos: Bonds (.298, 41, 120 and Player of the Year), Sandberg (.300, 37, 135) and Wallach (.302, 23, 102) batting three-four-five in the order.

For Eric Rogers and Banff, it will be looking forward to three tough Amigos in 1992: Will Clark, Frank Thomas and Jay Buhner.

For John Gatto and Chicago, it will be hoping that there is more to life than Dave Parker in 1992 (.270, 20, 98).

For Bob Weisman and Zagazig, it will have very little to do with baseball, as he found out he would be a father soon.

For Mark Hetterich and Pensacola, it will be the dramatic turnaround from 1990, a last-to-first escapade that proved that real life imitates the TML.

For Ralph Geiger and Tuscaloosa, it may be the unlikely hero Dave Magadan leading the team in runs created.

For Hank Pedicone and Skayuna, it may be the discovery that TML style baseball is a whole lot more fun than he thought it would be, especially with the computer doing the stats.

For Flin Flon and all the managers, well, frankly, I don't know what they're going to remember.

For Nite Mahan and Niceville, it will be all those high scoring games, as his team had no trouble scoring and neither did his opponents.

For Jim Pertierra and Sherlock, it will be the thousands of games he played, and almost taking this team to the top. Actually, it'll be the way the American Reporter neglected to mention his team all year long.

For Craig Christmann and Los Angeles, it will be having the best record in the Association and still getting bumped off in the Wildcard Playoff.

For Gerry Klug and Molly, it will be the Seattle Raniers.

For Larry Rumsey and Coldwater, it will be Cecil Fielder nearly hitting as many home runs as his whole team did in 1990.

And for the various and sundry managers who handled Tougaloo, it will be each win, since there were so few that each stands out as a unique experience.

It seems to me that the bad luck came during TML XII and that the thriteenth year could be the best ever. See you then.

Rob Dibble, who had to come in and put out Myers' fire in the 9th, earned the win, by fanning the final two batters of the game, including the Wombat version of Rickey! This gave the KENTUCKY WARDOGS an incredbile 4th TML Championship and their 3rd in the past 5 years!
